## **Elements of Prospective Interlocal Agreement Between The City of Austin and BSEACD**

- 1. Enabling interconnections to AWU system by certain BSEACD PWS permittees during declared droughts as a substitute water supply without a commitment to annexation, in exchange for greater than mandatory curtailments during the interconnection period.
- 2. Collaborating activities and aligning messages concerning **joint education and outreach on water conservation.**
- 3. Providing 4% of permittees' water-use fees annually (currently equivalent to \$20,000) to the City's Salamander Conservation Fund, paid quarterly, and adding one District Director, elected by Board, to the governing Conservation Fund Advisory Committee.
- 4. Convening a biennial conference of experts in the physical and biological ecology of the aquifer, Barton Springs and its endangered species to evaluate what has been learned in the prior two years and what priorities should be emphasized in future research efforts.
- 5. Providing \$15,000 in District funds over a two year period, to be matched by the City, for conducting a study of salamander migration and mobility and possibly other objectives by a mutually agreed third-party.
- 6. Funding, designing and installing an **improved low flow spring flow measurement system** by the City and providing \$4000 in District funds annually to defray the cost of a improved continuous, telemetered-data USGS gaging station for better springflow measurements during extreme drought.
- 7. Adopting District rules that will **prevent re-permitting of retired historic use and quantified additional recharge** from recharge enhancement facilities within the District.
- 8. Continuing to support the service of a **District Board-nominated District staff** member on the City's Environmental Board.
